Red shirts filled the streets as nearly a hundred volunteers showed up in the wee morning hours to help clean and express their commitment to the ever improving community of Jefferson Park. Shovels, rakes, and gloves saved hands (though some toes were bloodied) as neighbors worked to not only clean up, but instill new beauty to our park and neighborhood.

Early morning began with Jack and Grill breakfast burritos, Starbucks coffee, and bottled water from Riley's Radiator Shop . After eating and a brief pep talk by Colorado State House Rep. Joel Judd (D), residents began a bit of knuckle bashing work. One crew worked to create a new flower bed, others split off to clean the various streets and alleys, and yet still others put down mulch around existing trees. And yet it was not simply neighbors who helped on Jefferson Park Day. Other groups swooped from seemingly nowhere to fill our ranks with fresh hands and a more diversified agenda.

Groundworks Denver planted trees 19 new trees in the park, bringing with them a Latino youth leadership group to help in the effort. That



number was increased last week by 59 new trees put in by the city. Invesco field sent two people over to help with clean up along with some great prizes for our raffle. Tina Romero from Parks and Rec were out to

support and oversee our efforts, and even sent Jefferson Park Neighbors and all volunteers a great thank you letter for all your hard work!

As the day went on, and I busily tried to get up a tent for the band (I failed), Riverside Baptist showed up for another year in a row to feed almost a 150 people with burgers and dogs. The food was devoured by hungry workers who discovered the park full of music and events upon their return. Local resident Nethanel Bender's band 4hire played courtesy of Zocalo Development. New Life in Christ did some face painting for the kids, while a local massage student named Jennifer soothed parents weary muscles.

Though we are still waiting for a comprehensive list of donors which will be feature next month. We would like to thank everyone for their time, contributions, and continued support of our neighborhood and home.
