

Minutes JPUN Board Meeting  
May 22, 2010

Present: Tom Blyth, Kim Collie, Al DeMendoza, Katherine Meldrum, Brooke Bailey, Joan Bancroft and Joan Bondy.

Brooke gave an initial report on the Jefferson Park day financial status. It appears there will be some overage that may be available for future events. Tom, Kim and Brooke will verify that all donors, vendors, and business who attended the event are thanked and letters verifying donations will be sent.

Michael will write an article about JPUN day for our newsletter and possibly for the Denver Post Your Hub sections. We may be able to modify the article and purchase a 1/4 page ad in the North Denver Tribune that thanks all the businesses involved in the event.

The sign in sheet at JPUN day resulted in significant interest in the Outlaw event 7/24, the fund raiser at the Highlands event in June and the garden project JPUN has begun with DUG on 26<sup>th</sup> and Clay.

A recap of all the donors and events from JPUN day will be posted on the WEB site when finalized.

Jerry is continuing his work for an entrance to Jefferson Park at the 23 exits from I25.

Kat reported that the new neighborhood inspector has been very active in out neighborhood. Any environmental issues can be referred to Katherine Melddrum.

Land Use – Tom is pursuing having the sculpture donated by Allied installed in the park.

Brooke attended the North West Denver neighborhood meeting. She got the information HUNI uses to develop good neighbor agreements. We will try to get that started in Jefferson Park, starting with the opening of the theater on 25<sup>th</sup>. It includes clauses that can be inserted into the liquor license that insure neighbors will not be negatively impacted with things like delivery and dumping bottles late at night.

Kat reported on the incidence of a gang fight in the neighborhood. It has prompted a letter to a landlord requesting the eviction of known gang members and the involvement of the Denver neighborhood inspector that issuing a nuisance abatement.

Brooke and Kim reported on the upcoming social events:

June 17 Happy hour on the roof of the Frontview 40 project. JPUN may be able to fund beer and wine and Pizza is being donated.

July 24 Party/game for the Outlaws and Invesco – tickets are free to those who sign up ahead of time

An event will be planned for National Night Out in August.

Al plans to reach out to neighborhood businesses to invite them to get involved with JPUN. Brooke suggested he start with the Pinata store at 23<sup>rd</sup> and Federal. They donated a piñata for Jefferson Park day and expressed interest in the organization.
